COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOWS AND THE LONG TERM CONTROL PLAN

DELCORA is in the beginning stages of the planning process for updating our Long Term Control Plan. The overall planning approach for the development of a Long Term Control Plan consists of three major steps, which include system characterization, the development and evaluation of alternatives, and the selection and implementation of the controls. DELCORA has developed a Public Participation Plan and is in the process of implementing this public participation process that will actively involve the affected public throughout the development of the Long Term Control Plan. During the public participation process, DELCORA staff and our Engineering and Program Management Consultant, Greeley and Hansen, will present Public Outreach Materials and receive questions and comments. There are multiple ways for the public to be involved, including at public meetings, receiving periodic updates via mailers and/ or our website, and also via solicitation of public input through periodic surveys.

The main objective of the public meetings and the engagement tools that will be implemented, as noted in the Public Participation Plan, are to foster public awareness and actively facilitate public involvement by taking into consideration public input during the decision making process and selection of the final long term CSO controls.

DELCORA will also maintain a website containing information about the Authority and the CSO system.

The public meeting locations will be held at different locations, as identified above, in order to maximize the likelihood of attendance for residents and stakeholders. The facilities will have ample meeting space. These locations serve a vital role in Delaware County as central meeting places and serve as gathering places for the local community, as well as the hosting of numerous public events, including public information meetings, and are all free to the public.

The first public meeting will be used to brief the public on the history, scope and purpose of the study and to obtain their general views on the study. At this meeting, a general presentation with information on DELCORA and its CSO Long Term Control Plan program will be given to the public. This meeting will provide an effective forum to obtain inputs from interested individuals and organizations.

Public meetings will be held over the course of the Long Term Control Plan development effort to actively solicit input to its updated Long Term Control Plan from stakeholders, including the public, customer communities, and the regulatory agencies.
